Chandrayaan-3:

India has become the first country to successfully land the spacecraft, Chandrayaan-3 near the south pole of the moon on 23rd August 2023. India chairs G-20 Presidency since December 2022

Hon'ble PM Shri Narendra Modi addressed the G20 Trade and Investment Ministers' Meeting:

The Hon'ble Prime Minister of India, Shri Narendra Modi addressed the G20 Trade and Investment Ministers' Meeting held in Jaipur, Rajasthan, India in virtual format on 24 August 2023. Highlighting the global optimism and confidence in the Indian economy, the Prime Minister stated that, India is seen as a "combination of openness, opportunities and options". The Prime Minister highlighted that, India has become the fifth-largest global economy, and the country's economy exhibits increased competitiveness, enhanced transparency, expanding digitization and the promotion of innovation. Prime Minister further added that India has established dedicated freight corridors and built industrial zones. Prime Minister underlined that the government is committed to making India the third-largest global economy in the next few years.

The first Royal Tiger Reserve in Malaysia, inspired by India's success of Project Tiger, under National Tiger Conservation Authority was inaugurated on 29 July. Earlier, HRH Tengku Hassanal Ibrahim, Regent of Pahang had represented Malaysia at the commemorative event to mark 50 years of Project Tiger in Mysuru, India on 23 April. Hon'ble PM of India, Shri Narendra Modi launched the International Big Cats Alliance during the event. On 28 July, Deputy High Commissioner, Ms. Subhashini Narayanan attended the day-long First Pahang Tiger Summit 2023, held in Kuantan. Productive discussions took place on Tiger conservation & habitat preservation. Mr. Mohnish Kapoor, Head - Programme and Partnerships, Global Tiger Forum spoke on India's Project Tiger at Pahang Tiger Summit 2023.



Engagements of High Commission of India Kuala Lumpur



Air Chief Marshal, Mr. VR Chaudhari, Chief of Air Staff (CAS) of Indian Air Force was on a 4-day official visit to Malaysia from 3-6 July 2023. High Commissioner, Mr. B.N. Reddy received Air Chief Marshal, Mr. VR Chaudhari at High Commission on July 4. Earlier in the day, Air Chief Marshal held detailed discussions with General Tan Sri Dato' Sri Mohd Asghar Khan, Chief of Air Force, Royal Malaysian Air Force. With commonality of air force platforms, Indian Air Force and Royal Malaysian Air Force look to deepen their engagement in the entire spectrum of collaboration, including Joint Air Exercises next year.

On July 18, Prime Minister of Malaysia, Dato' Seri Anwar Ibrahim received a courtesy call from the Grand Mufti of India and the Founder of Jamia Markaz, Kerala, India, Mr. Al-Allamah Syeikh Abu Bakar Ahmad Al-Malibari at his office in Putrajaya.

The prime minister said he was honoured and expressed his highest appreciation to Sheikh Abu Bakar for the visit. In his Facebook post on July 18, PM Anwar said that Mr. Syeikh Abu Bakar was expected to attend a number of knowledge sessions, including the Sahih Al-Bukhari Appreciation Seminar and the Launch of the National Level Sahih Al-Bukhari Hadith Conference on July 22 in Putrajaya. PM Anwar said that, last year, he was invited by Mr. Sheikh Abu Bakar to Jamia Markaz, located in the Markaz Knowledge City in Kozhikode, Kerala. The prime minister said, while he was in Kerala for several days, he pursued several community development initiatives, in addition to mingling with students there.



Clean energy solutions provider, Gentari Sdn Bhd, a subsidiary of Petroliaam Nasional Bhd (Petronas), has appointed energy industry veteran, Navjit Gill as its country head for India, effective July 10.

Gentari has identified India as one of its top markets in its renewable energy push. Gentari chief executive officer, Sushil Purohit said in a statement on July 17 that, with India's increasing focus on achieving net zero goals, the country presents extensive opportunities for global private players to contribute. The company said that, Gentari India's initiatives will complement Gentari's 2030 global aspirations in building a renewable energy capacity of more than 30 gigawatts and supplying more than 700,000 tonnes per year of clean hydrogen. Gentari aimed to establish 25,000 public charging points for electric vehicles in key markets in Asia-Pacific. Mr. Gill has 34 years of experience in the energy and marine sectors. He was formerly the chief executive officer of First Energy Pvt Ltd and the chief commercial officer at SB Energy.



High Commissioner, Mr. B.N. Reddy addressed the students of Universiti Teknologi Malaysia (UTM), under Ambassadors' Global Lecture series on the topic 'India's Digital Public Infrastructure (DPI): Development of New Ecosystem' on 27 July 2023. High Commissioner elaborated on India's successful journey in creating Digital Public Infrastructure and highlighted the scope for India-Malaysia partnership in the digital domain.



High Commissioner met the Malaysian youth of Indian origin, who would be attending the 66th Know India Programme which commenced from 30 August for 3 weeks to reconnect with their Indian roots & to know about New India on 25 July. Malaysian Youth of Indian Origin were regular participants in all the previous editions of KIP. Know India Programme offers an opportunity to learn about exciting developments in India in the fields of science, space, digital infrastructure, India Stack, defence and agriculture besides the cultural and civilizational heritage of India.

The 10th meeting of Sub Committee on Military Cooperation between India & Malaysia was held in New Delhi on 27 July. The defence cooperation was reviewed during the meeting, with wide-ranging discussions held on issues of mutual interest. The Indian delegation was led by Joint Secretary (International Cooperation), Ministry of Defence, Shri Amitabh Prasad, while the Malaysian side was headed by Assistant Chief of Staff, Defence Operations and Training



Maj Gen Dato' Khairul Anuar bin Abd Aziz. During the meeting, the existing defence cooperation between the two countries was reviewed and wide-ranging discussions were held on issues of mutual interest. Both sides explored effective and practical initiatives to further expand the bilateral defence engagements. The Indian side highlighted the potential of the Indian defence industry with capacity and capability to cooperate with the Malaysian Armed Forces in its shipbuilding and maintenance plans. Both the co-chairs also deliberated on the possible outcomes for the 12th Malaysia-India Defence Cooperation Committee (MIDCOM) meeting which will be held at the level of Defence Secretary in India in September this year. Both sides reaffirmed their commitment to fully implement the Enhanced Strategic Partnership based on mutual trust & understanding, common interests and shared values of democracy & rule of law. The Enhanced Strategic Partnership was established during the visit of Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi to Malaysia in 2015.

High Commission of India organised commemoration of Ashadha Purnima on 31 July 2023, which marks the first sermon delivered by Lord Buddha. The Event was held at Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose Indian Cultural Centre and was attended by over 100 participants. The High Commission held the event together with three partner organisations - Vajrayana Buddhist Council of Malaysia (VBCM), Itipiso Bhagavad Club (IBC Malaysia) and Maha Karuna Buddhist Society, Malaysia. Ming Ji (Malaysia Buddhist Association, KL & Selangor), Ven. Palden Nyinma Rinpoche (Kunzang Chorkor Ling PJ) and their followers, and H. E. ACS(Ret) Sumangala Dias, High Commissioner of Sri Lanka, attended the event. Three Eminent speakers, Ven. Bhante Ridigama Wanarathana, Ven. Sing Kan and Ven. Dr Karma Tashi Choedron, representing the three Buddhist traditions, delivered talks on the significance of Ashadha Purnima.

1. **India Among Top Five in Renewable Energy: PM Modi**

Prime Minister Narendra Modi lauded India's renewable energy success. He said our country is one of the top five countries globally having installed renewable energy capacity. The PM was addressing the G20 Environment and Climate Sustainability ministerial meeting in Delhi. He underlined the country's vision that aims to attain 'Net Zero' by 2070 which includes cutting down greenhouse gas emissions largely as close to zero as possible. 2. **India is now home to 75% of tigers in the world**

India recorded a 23.5% increase in tiger population between 2018 and 2022, taking the number of big cats in the wild to 3,682, more than the initially estimated 3,167 and accounting for 75% of the tigers in the world. In April, Prime Minister Narendra Modi had released an interim estimation of 3,167 tigers. India had 2,197 tigers in 2018, up from 1,411 tigers in 2006. The increase shows the success of the country's 20-year-old science-based tiger conservation programme, experts said...[read more](#)

3. **India's GDP to reach \$6 trillion by 2030 : Standard Chartered Research**

India's GDP will nearly double in the next seven years to \$6 trillion, and per capita income will increase to \$4,000 by 2030, Standard Chartered Bank Research said in a report. India's drivers of growth will be consistent policy reforms, macro stability, healthy financial sector, large share of working population, digitalisation and political stability, public capex push, it added. 7. **1 lakh 29 thousand trained under Pravasi Kaushal Vikas Yojana to equip people with soft skills to compete in foreign destinations**

The National Skill Development Corporation, under the aegis of Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship (MSDE) in association with Ministry of External Affairs (MEA), is imparting a one-day Pre-Departure Orientation Training (PDOT) to potential migrants under the Pravasi Kaushal Vikas Yojana (PKVY) scheme. The training aims to equip them with the necessary soft skills to compete in foreign destinations. Spotlight and Opportunities in India

Chemical Industry



- India is the 6th largest producer of chemicals in the world and 3rd in Asia, contributing 7% to India's GDP. India's chemical sector, which is estimated to be worth US\$ 220 billion in 2022 and is anticipated to grow to US\$ 300 billion by 2025 and US\$ 1 trillion by 2040.
- Covering more than 80,000 commercial products, India's chemical industry is extremely diversified and can be broadly classified into bulk chemicals, specialty chemicals, agrochemicals, petrochemicals, polymers, and fertilizers.
- Globally, India is the fourth-largest producer of agrochemicals after the United States, Japan and China. India accounts for 16-18% of the world production of dyestuffs and dye intermediates. Indian colorants industry has emerged as a key player with a global market share of ~15%. The country's chemicals industry is de-licensed, except for few hazardous chemicals. India holds a strong position in exports and imports of chemicals at a global level and ranks 14th in exports and 8th in imports at global level (excluding pharmaceuticals).
- The Department of Chemicals & Petrochemicals intend to bring PLI in chemical & petrochemical sector and will redraft the Petroleum, Chemicals and Petrochemicals Investment Region (PCPIR) guidelines.
- Moreover, according to the CRISIL report, the specialty chemicals market in India would grow faster than China, increasing its market share to 6% by 2026 from 3-4% in fiscal 2021. A shift in the global supply chain brought on by the China+1 strategy and a resurgence in domestic end-user demand will fuel significant revenue growth of 18–20% in 2022 and 14–15% in 2023.
