

### **INDIA-MALAYSIA BILATERAL RELATIONS**

India established diplomatic relations with the Federation of Malaya (predecessor state of Malaysia) in 1957. In 2010, the bilateral ties were elevated to Strategic Partnership during visit of PM Manmohan Singh to Malaysia. India-Malaysia relations were elevated to Enhanced Strategic Partnership, during the visit of PM Shri Narendra Modi to Malaysia in November 2015. Malaysia hosts approximately 2.75 million PIOs, which is the second largest PIO community in the world after the US. Malaysia has the third largest Indian diaspora in the world (2.9 mn). During the recent visit of PM Anwar Ibrahim to India on 19-21 August 2024, , the India-Malaysia bilateral ties were elevated to Comprehensive Strategic Partnership opening a new chapter in the relationship.

Ibrahim to India. Apart from above there are Joint Working Groups on Counter Terrorism and Transnational Crime, Science and Technology, Information Technology, Labor, on Higher Education, Renewable Energy, Public Administration and mechanism of Bilateral Technical Meeting (BTM) on Cooperation in the Field of Traditional Medicine.

As per official figures (DPIIT), Malaysia ranks as the 31st largest · investor in India with FDI inflow of US\$ 1.18 billion during the period April 2000 to September 2023 (Source: DPIIT, Gol). Malaysian investments in India, including third party routes are estimated to be around US\$3.3 billion. Around 70 Malaysian companies, including joint ventures, have established operations in India, focusing on diverse sectors like infrastructure, healthcare, telecommunications, oil and gas, power plants, tourism, and human resources. The largest presence of Malaysian construction companies outside Malaysia is in India. According to Malaysia's Construction Industry Development Board (CIDB), as on December 2016, Malaysian companies have completed 98 highway & road projects worth US \$4.64 billion in India. IJM alone has done over 1,500 km of road projects in India.

Indian companies have invested in around 250 manufacturing . projects of over US\$ 2.62 billion (RM 8.74 billion) in Malaysia which includes investment of RM 5.5 billion (approx. US\$ 1.37 billion) by around 135 Indian companies in the manufacturing sector creating over 15,000 jobs till December 2020.(Source: MIDA, GoM). Prominent Indian investors/projects include Biocon Malaysia, Recron Malaysia SdnBhd (owned by the Reliance group), UNZA Malaysia (owned by Wipro), Ranbaxy Malaysia, Melaka Manipal Medical College in Melaka and the Melaka International College in Nilai, among others. Veeda Clinical Research Organization, Ahmedabad has set up its advanced research unit at Ampang Hospital in Kuala Lumpur

Presently, there are more than 150 Indian companies, including 61 · Indian joint ven-tures and 3 Indian Public Sector Undertakings operating in Malaysia. Indian Landmark group operates 15 stores in Malaysia under the brand name Max fashion. IRCON started its opera-tion in Malaysia in the year 1988, and till date has commissioned 15 projects involving 580 km of track rehabilitation and about 298 km of new lines. Indian IT firms began venturing into Malaysia from 1990s. Over the last three decades, the number of companies grew to over 100 in number generating an annual average revenue of US\$260 million. The cumulative in-vestments are over of over US\$250 million in Malaysia. The top IT/ITES companies in Malay-sia are: Tech Mahindra, Tata Consultancy Services, Infosys, Ramcosystems, WIPRO Limited etc

#### Economic & Commercial relations

Economic and commercial engagement has become one the important pillars of India-Malaysia Enhanced Strategic Partnership. Malaysia is India's 3rd largest trading partner in ASEAN. A bilateral Comprehensive Economic Cooperation Agreement (CECA) covering goods, services and investment came into effect from 1 July 2011. ASEAN- India Trade in Goods Agreement (AITIGA) came into force in January 2010 while ASEAN-India Agreements on Trade in Services & Investment is operational since July 2015. The AITIGA review is currently ongoing and is expected to be completed by 2025. India's primary exports to Malaysia consist of mineral fuels, mineral oils, aluminum and related articles, meat and edible meat offal, iron and steel, copper and related articles, organic chemicals, nuclear reactors, boilers, machinery and mechanical appliances, electrical machinery and equipment, and more. India's major import items from Malaysia are palm oil, mineral fuels, mineral oils, electrical machinery and equipment; animal or vegetable fats and oils and their cleavage products; nuclear reactors, boilers, machinery and mechanical appliances; copper and articles thereof, wood; wood charcoal, aluminium, organic chemicals, iron and steel and miscellaneous chemical products

Malaysia India Digital Council: As part of the Comprehensive Strategic Partnership, both countries have established a Malaysia India Digital Council in the area of digital cooperation to guide engagement in the digital realm and accelerate collaboration in this area such as Digital Public Infrastructure, digital B2B partnership, digital capacity building, cyber security, emerging technologies such as 5G, quantum computing, cloud computing, Internet of Things among others, between the two countries.

### **Defence Cooperation**

India-Malaysia defence relations have steadily grown over the years, from military training to supply of defence equipment and enhanced security dialogues. The MoU on Defence Cooperation signed in 1993 is the cornerstone of defence relations between the two countries. Hon'ble Defence Minister of India, Shri Rajnath Singh paid an official visit to Malaysia from July 10-11, 2023. Amendment to the MoU was signed in July 2023, during the visit by Hon'ble RM to Malaysia. The first regional office of HAL was opened in Kuala Lumpur Traditional Medicine during RM's visit.13th edition of Malaysia India Defence Cooperation Meeting (MIDCOM) meeting took place in Malaysia on 19 February 2025 cohaired by Defence Secretaries of both countries

and 2 scholarships under the Education Exchange Programme (EEP) every year to Malay-sia. India also offers 20 seats under the AYUSH Scholarship Scheme to Malaysian students for pursuing Bachelor degrees in Ayurveda, Siddha, Unani and Homeopathy medicine in Indian institutions / colleges. There are 4 CBSE schools in Malaysia: Global Indian Interna-tional School (until Class XII), Vikas International School (until Class X) and Valley Interna-tional School (until Class VIII) and Sprouts Academy (until Class V). Discussions have been underway to set up a branch campus of IIT in Malaysia.

Indian Scholarship and Trust Fund: The ISTF was created in 1946 by Prime Minister Nehru to benefit the Malaysian-Indian students. Over the years, the corpus of the Fund has been augmented including during PM Modi visit in 2015 with additional grant of RM 3 million. Since 1996, more than RM3.1 million has been disbursed from the ISTF, benefitting more than 1,000 Malaysian Indian students. For the year FY2023-24, 57 Malaysian-Indian students received RM 200,500 in scholarships.

Regualar staff talks between services at apec level has been ectremenly succesful. The 9th Army to Army Staff Talks was conducted in Jun 2023, in Hyderabad. The 11th Air Force Staff Talks was conducted in New Delhi from 05 - 07 Nov 2024. 9th Navy to Navy talks between Indian Navy and the Royal Malaysian Navy was concluded in New Delhi from 23-25 July 2024.

This year a 'Mini Defence Expo cum Defence Industry Symposium' Cultural Cooperation was conducted on 16 January 2025 in Kuala Lumpur together with Department of Defence Production (DDP) and Malaysia's Defence Industry Division (DID). The Hon'ble Minister of Defence of Malaysia YB Dato' Seri Mohamed Khaled bin Nordin inaugurated the Mini Defence Expo organised by the High Commission.

Bilateral exercises are a core part of defence copperation. The recent edition of the army Exercise HARIMAU SHAKTI was conducted in Bentong Camp, Malaysia from 02-15 Dec 2024 and saw participation by Indian Army contingent of 78 personnel. In 2024, naval Exercise SAMUDRA LAKSAMANA was conducted from Feb 28-March 02 2024 off the coast of Visakhapatnam. Bilateral Air Exercise UDARA SHAKTI took place Kuantan Malaysia from 05-10 August 2024.

# Education

The Indian Cultural Centre Kuala Lumpur, under ICCR was established in February 2010 to conduct classes in Carnatic Vocal, Kathak dance, Yoga, Hindi language by trained teachers from India and Malaysia. The Centre was renamed as Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose Indian Cultural Center (NSCBICC) by PM Narendra Modi during his visit to Malaysia in November 2015. Regular free Hindi classes have started at NSCBICC from June 2024.

GOPIO Malaysia and GOPIO International, Malaysia in partnership with the Mission and various community organizations successfully organized the 2nd PIO Day (Apravasi Diwas) and the 15th GOPIO International Convention, jointly inaugurated by Hon'ble Minister for Digital of Malaysia YB Gobind Singh Deo and Hon'ble Minister of State for External Affairs HE.Mr.Kirti Vardhan Singh on 14 Sep 2024, at the iconic Vivekananda Ashram and School premises in Kuala Lumpur from 13-16 September 2024.

Confluence: Samagam- Language Series- The High Commission of

India and Malaysia signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) (NSCBICC) launched the "Confluence: Samagam- the Language in 2010 for bilateral co-operation in higher education. There are Series" in April 2024 to promote and propagate Indian languages approximately 8,998 Indian students (both in schools and higher prominently spoken in Malaysia including Tamil, Telugu, Punjabi, education institutes) in Malaysia (December 2023). There are close Hindi, Malayalam, Odia, Bengali and Gujarati. Six editions of the linkages between the Indian and Malaysian higher educational Language series on Punjabi, Telugu and Tamil language have been institutions with over 500 MoUs/Agreements. An estimated 3,000 Malaysian students are studying in India. India of-fered 40 ITEC slots to Malaysia during the Financial Year (FY) 2023-24 which were fully uti-lized. The Indian Council for Cultural Relations (ICCR) offers 3 scholarships under the General Scholarship Scheme (GSS)

# Indian community/ Consular/Manpower Issues/Persons of India Origin (PIOs):

There are approx. 185,000 NRIs both skilled and unskilled in Malaysia. The number of Indian expats in Malaysia is around 25,000. Total number of Persons of Indian Origin is around 2.75 million (about 6.8% of Malaysia's population). 90% of PIOs speak Tamil and the rest speak Telugu, Malayalam, Punjabi, Bengali, Gujarati, Marathi, etc. Malaysia has the third largest Indian diaspora in the world (2.9 mn). There are almost 20,000 Hindu temples and over 120 Gurudwaras in the country. 90% of PIOs speak Tamil and the rest speak Telugu, Malayalam, Punjabi, Bengali, Gujarati, Marathi, etc.

Malaysia has been sending the largest contingent to the Pravasi Bharatiya Divas and currently there are seven PBS Awardees from Malaysia, namely Tun Samy Vellu, Tan Sri Somasundaram, Tan Sri Vadiveloo, Tan Sri Ajit Singh, Tan Sri Datuk Ravindran Menon and Tan Sri Dr. Thambirajah Muniandy and Tan Sri Dr S. Subramaniam (awarded in 2025). The largest ever Malaysian contingent (around 527) led by Tan Sri SA Vigneswaran, the current President of Malaysian Indian Congress (MIC) participated in PBD Convention in Varanasi in January 2019. A 100 member contingent from Malaysia visited Bhubaneshwar to take part in the PBD Convention in January 2025 led by YB Gobind Singh Deo, Minister of Digital of Malaysia.

# Tourism and Civil Aviation Sector Cooperation

India was the 7th largest source country for inbound tourism to Malaysia with over 735,000 Indian tourists visiting Malaysia in 2019. For the year 2023, these numbers are 254,562 (Malaysian tourists to India) and 671,846 (Indian tourists to Malaysia). Malaysia was the largest source country from South East Asia for foreign tourists visiting India with 334,500 Malaysian tourists in 2019 (Source: Tourism Malaysia). Before the Covid-19 Pandemic, there were over 233 weekly flights connecting 19 Indian cities with Malaysia. Presently, in terms of air accessibility, 284 flights (As of December 2024) are operated weekly between India and Malaysia through Malaysia Airlines, Batik Air, AirAsia, Air Asia X, Air India and IndiGo. The Government of Malaysia announced visa-free travel for Indian Nationals from 01 December 2023 until 31 December 2024 to promote inbound tourism to Malaysia. India has allowed gratis e-tourist visa for 30 days for Malaysian travellers. Air India began operations from 15 September, 2024.
