




4. High Commission of India in association with Malaysian Telugu Community organized Ugadi celebrations on 20 April to commemorate bapu@150. Shri Nishit Kumar Ujjwal, Counsellor (Community Affairs) represented High Commission of India while YB. Mr. Ganabatirao, State Minister of Selangor also attended the event. A tribute was paid to Gandhiji through audio-visual presentation and a patriotic dance drama. Large number of Indian diaspora was present in the event. The event was covered not only by Malaysian media but also by media in Andhra Pradesh, India.









5. Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose Indian Cultural Centre (NSCBICC), Kuala Lumpur in collaboration with Global Indian International School (GIIS) Kuala Lumpur organised a talk on "The relevance of Gandhian Principles on Contemporary Issues" at GIIS on 24th April, 2019 to commemorate 150th Birth Anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi. The talk was delivered by Smt. Devi Kunjari Sambanthan, daughter of Tun V. Sambanthan (the first Indian origin Minister of then Malaya). The talk was attended by the students from the Gangwon Foreign Language High School (GFLHS), a private school from South Korea, who have visited GIIS and participated in the GIIS Cultural Exchange Programme. Shri K. Avyanar, Director NSCBICC represented the High Commission and Ms. Jung Inhee, Second Secretary of the Embassy of the Republic of Korea also attended the event. Smt.Deva Kunjari has shared on how Gandhji's values and principles contributed to the current political, social and community scenarios and on preserving concepts of non-violence, satyagraha, non-cooperation, religious tolerance, simple living and rural empowerment. The talk was well attended and received an overwhelming response.



6. High Commission of India in partnership with Myskills Foundation NGO inaugurated 'Mahatma Gandhi Memorial Park' in Selangor State on 26 April 2019 to commemorate the 150th birth anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi. Planting of 150 trees in the campus of Myskills Foundation was a part of the event. Myskills Foundation is a local Malaysian NGO which provides vocational training to under-privileged youths to help them to be a part of the mainstream society. Event witnessed enthusiastic participation from many prominent members of Indian diaspora including a representative from Chinese and Malay Community. Sh. Nishit Kumar Ujjwal, Counsellor (Community Affairs, Labour& Edu) represented the High Commission of India and Sh. M. Kulasegaran, Human Resource Government of Malaysia, Minister. represented the Malaysian Government. Among other prominent dignitaries Ms. KamacheDorayrajoo, Member of State Assembly of Pahang State, was also present in the event. Both Sh. Mr. Kulasegaran and Sh. Nishit Kumar Ujjwal, jointly unveiled the statue of Mahatma Gandhi and participated in the tree plantation drive. Hundred and fifty (150) saplings of trees were planted in the honour of Gandhiji and the place was named at "Mahatma Gandhi Memorial Park". The event evoked widespread enthusiasm from the Malaysian Indian community and also got wide media publicity. A detailed report on this event has already been sent to the Ministry.

7. In partnership with the High Commission of India, All Malaysia Malayalee Associations (AMMA) commemorated 150th birth anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi during their Vishu festival celebrations. The event was organized on 21April 2019 at Putrajaya. Around 500 Malayalee Malaysians and their families attended the event. The highlight of the event was the Gandhi theme-based fancy dress and painting competition by school children, which was highly appreciated by participants.







8. Netaji Subash Chandra Bose Indian Cultural Centre (NSCBICC) in association with Malaysia Telugu Foundation Production organised the 15th Chithirai Puthandu Mathura Geetham – One Indian One Community to commemorate the 150th Birth Anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi. The event was organized at Temple of Fine Arts, Kuala Lumpur on 28 April 2019. Shri K. Ayyanar, Director NSCBICC represented the High Commission of India. More than 300 people attended the event which featured various cultural performances.
