India chairs G-20 Presidency since 1 December 2022 : Hon'ble Prime Minister of India, Shri Narendra Modi addressed Virtual G20 Leaders' Summit :

A virtual G20 Leaders' Summit, chaired by the Prime Minister of India, Shri Narendra Modi was held on 22 November 2023. Leaders of all G20 Members including the Chair of the African Union, as well as nine Guest countries, and Heads of 11 International Organizations, have been invited to participate in the Summit. The Virtual G20 Summit pushed for effective implementation of various G20 decisions, including through relevant national and international platforms. While delivering his address at the Summit, PM Shri Modi underscored that There are growing concerns across the world on negative use of Artificial Intelligence, (AI). PM Shri Modi also stated that, AI should reach the people, and it must be safe for society. PM also emphasised that, it is in the interest of the international community to work together on the global regulations for AI.



Official Visit of the Foreign Minister of Malaysia, YB Dato' Seri Diraja Dr Zambry Abd Kadir to India

His Majesty Al Aminul Karim Sultan Sallehuddin Ibni Almarhum Sultan Badlishah, inaugurated the new Gandhi Hall (Dewan Gandhi) at Sungai Petani on 9 November 2023. On this day, 68 years ago, in 1955, His Majesty's father, Late Sultan Badlishah had inaugurated the original Gandhi Hall. HRH Sultanah Maliha Binti Almarhum Tengku Ariff, Sultanah Negeri Kedah Darul Ama, Tunku Mahkota of Kedah, HRH Tunku Shazuddin Ariff and Tunku Puan Mahkota of Kedah, HRH Che Puan Nur Julie Ariff also graced the occasion. Chief Minister of Kedah, Dato' Seri Muhammad Sanusi Md. Nor and Kedah State Secretary, Dato' Seri Haji Norizan Khazali were also present. The Management Committee of Dewan Gandhi led by Chairman Mr Venoogobal Gobindasamy highlighted the historic nature of the occasion, and thanked various donors including India for its financial support in the construction. High Commissioner, Mr. B.N.Reddy described the new Gandhi Hall is a living testament to the continued relevance of Gandhian values to address modern day challenges, and an enduring bond between India and Malaysia, strengthened by the tireless efforts of the Indian community in Malaysia. The new Gandhi Hall Building is constructed with funds raised from various sources including the Government of Malaysia, the Kedah State Government, the Government of India and donors from Malaysian Indian community and friends of Gandhi Hall. HRH Tuanku Sultan of Kedah also visited an exhibition on the life and times of Mahatma Gandhi- organized by the High Commission at the New Dewan Gandhi with support from Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose Indian Cultural Centre KL . High Commissioner, Mr. B.N. High Commissioner also detailed burgeoning business opportunities for Malaysian companies and investors in New India across sectors including renewable energy, healthcare, digitalisation, infrastructure and manufacturing.

Mr Niloy Banerjee, Resident Representative, UNDP spoke about UN’s efforts in promotion of Gandhian values & distributed prizes to the winners of Gandhi Memorial Debate competition in which over 14 Malaysian Universities participated on various themes dear to Mahatma Gandhi.



High Commissioner met Malaysia’s Minister for Communications and Digital, Mr. Fahmi Fadzil on 11 October 2023.

Senior officials, including Chairman of Malaysian Communications and Multimedia Commission (MCMC), Tan Sri Mohamad Salim and CEO of Malaysia Digital Economy Corporation (MDEC), Mr. Mahadhir Aziz were present in the Meeting. Discussions focused on strengthening India-Malaysia engagement in information/digital technologies and digital talent development and also on exploring the setting up of bilateral collaborative mechanisms with representatives from the

governments and the businesses. Both sides also discussed about greater collaboration between Indian telecom companies and their counterparts in Malaysia in cutting edge technologies and equipment indigenously developed in India.

18-member delegation from Higher Command Course (HCC-52) visited Malaysia, as part of their Foreign Study Tour from 16-21 October 2023.

1. 5G/6G waves are expected to boost the Indian economy over the next five years: KPMG

According to a report by KPMG released at the India Mobile Congress 2023, 5G/6G, satellite communications, and semiconductors are expected to collectively contribute about US\$ 240 billion to the Indian economy in the next five years, growing to around 1.6% of the gross domestic product (GDP) by FY28, made possible by favourable policies from the government and a large domestic market. The key policy recommendations include formulation of regulations and administrative processes in the context of digital connectivity infrastructure development (DCIP), transitioning from the assembly-only approach in electronics manufacturing to an end-to-end holistic approach, and encouraging low-cost component manufacturers to set up operations in India...[read more](#)

2. India opens Northeast states for foreign tourists by easing restricted area permits

The Restricted Area Permits (RAP) and Protected Area Permits (PAP), needed by foreign tourists to travel across three border states i.e. Arunachal Pradesh, Mizoram and Nagaland in North East India, have been considerably eased with very few rejections, Union Ministry of Tourism's Regional Director in North East said. Earlier, RAP or PAP was very difficult to get for foreigners, but to promote North East as a tourist destination, the restrictions have been eased. 4. India set to overtake Japan as third-largest economy by 2030: S&P Global

Spacetech startup Skyroot Aerospace, which created history by sending India's first privately built rocket, Vikram-S, into space last year, is gearing up to fire its first orbital space launch vehicle in the first quarter of 2024. 6. Women-led startups rise to 18% in past five years: Report

According to a report by WISER's Women's in India's Startup Ecosystem Report, women-led startups have risen to 18% in India in the past five years. India had roughly 6,000 startups 2017 of which 10% were led by female founders, and by 2022, it increased to 80,000 and the share of women-led startups risen to 18%. Spotlight and Opportunities in India

MSME (Micro Small and Medium Enterprises) Industry



- The Micro Small and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs) sector is a major contributor to the socio-economic development of the country. In India, the sector has gained significant importance due to its contribution to Gross Domestic Product (GDP) of the country and exports. The sector has also contributed immensely with respect to entrepreneurship development especially in semi-urban and rural areas of India. The number of MSMEs in the country is expected to grow from 63 million, of which only 25 million have ever availed credit from formal sources to approximately 75 million in the coming times, growing at a projected CAGR of 2.5%.
- MSMEs are being encouraged to market their products on the e-commerce site, especially through Government e-Marketplace (GeM), owned and run by the government, where from Ministries and PSUs (public sector undertakings) source their procurement.
- MSME Ministry has four statutory bodies namely, Khadi and Village Industries Commission (KVIC) who is responsible for promoting and developing khadi and village industries for providing employment opportunities in rural areas, thereby strengthening the rural economy, Coir Board in charge of promoting overall development of the coir industry and improving living conditions of workers in this industry, National Small Industries Corporation Limited (NSIC) responsible for promoting, aiding and fostering growth of micro and small enterprises in the country, generally on commercial basis, National Institute for Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises, (NI-MSME) in-charge of enterprise promotion and entrepreneurship development, enabling enterprise creation, performing diagnostic development studies for policy formulation, etc. and lastly, Mahatma Gandhi Institute for Rural Industrialisation (MGIRI) responsible for accelerating rural industrialisation for sustainable village economy, attract professionals and experts to Gram Swaraj, empower traditional artisans, encourage innovation through pilot study/field trials and R&D for alternative technology using local resources.
- The Government of India has envisioned doubling the Indian economy to US\$ 5 trillion in five years. In order to achieve this goal, career opportunities for the young population have been generated and MSMEs have the potential to serve as a key employment generator. Therefore, the government has taken up promotion of MSMEs in order to create new jobs in the sector. Further, the government aims to enhance MSME's share in exports and its contribution to GDP.
