Celebration of 150th Birth Anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi

The High Commission of India, Kuala Lumpur, in partnership with Cyberjaya University College of Medical Sciences (CUCMS) celebrated Bapu@150 - the 150th Birth Anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi on 2nd October 2019, in a special event at the Grand Hall of CUCMS, Selangor. - 2. The programme began with floral tributes to Mahatma Gandhi. He was felicitated by High Commissioner of India, H.E. Mr. Mridul Kumar and Tan Sri Dato Dr R. Palan, Pro Chancellor of CUCMS. The programme included presentation of the video commissioned by Ministry of External Affairs, India, on one of Gandhiji's favourite songs "Vaishnava Jana To Tene Kahiye", with artists from over 124 countries paying a musical tribute to Mahatma Gandhi; a short video on the life of Mahatma Gandhi; Kathak dance repertoire Mahatma, by Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose Indian Cultural Centre (NSCBICC), Kuala Lumpur, which offered a glimpse into the life and ideals of Gandhi. Noted Malaysian Singer, Dr. Hardev Kaur and group presented "Sabarmati Ke Sant Tu Ne Kar Diya Kamal", a patriotic song from the 1954 Bollywood film, Jagriti.
