Empanelment of Legal Firms

The High Commission of India invites expressions of interest from qualified and licensed lawyers in Malaysia to provide legal services for Indian nationals, as and when required. Expressions of interest are also invited from lawyers and legal firms currently empanelled with the High Commission, should they wish to continue and be considered as part of newly constituted panel of lawyers.

2. The lawyers and legal firms who send their expression of interest, must meet the following eligibility criteria:

- (a) Be a qualified Advocate & Solicitor of the High Court of Malaya and/or a registered law firm with a group of qualified lawyers who have a valid practicing certificate issued by the Malaysian Bar.
- (b) Possess a recognized law degree (LLB) and fulfill all professional requirements under the Legal Profession Act 1976 of Malaysia.
- (c) Have relevant professional experience and expertise in one or more of the following areas:
 - Labour disputes and employment-related matters
 - Immigration law and related matters
 - Trade and commercial disputes
 - Family and marital disputes

2. The lawyer must have the experience representing clients before Malaysian courts, tribunals, or relevant authorities with high standards of professional ethics and integrity. He or she must be able to provide legal advice, representation, and timely communication with the High Commission when required.

3. Preference may be given to lawyers who have substantial experience handling cases involving labour and migrant workers matters; possess a strong track record in mediation, negotiation, and litigation in the above-mentioned areas and are able to provide prompt legal consultation and assistance when requested.
