The event marked the 76th year of establishment of Indian Council for Cultural Relations (ICCR) founded on 9th April 1950 by Maulana Abul Kalam Azad, the first Education Minister of India with the objective of fostering and strengthening cultural relations and mutual understanding between India and the world.

In Kuala Lumpur, a full-fledged Indian Cultural Centre (ICC) was inaugurated on 10th February 2010 which was later renamed to Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose Indian Cultural Centre (NSCBICC) during the visit of H.E. Shri Narendra Modi, Hon'ble Prime Minister of India to Malaysia from 21st to 23rd November 2015.
