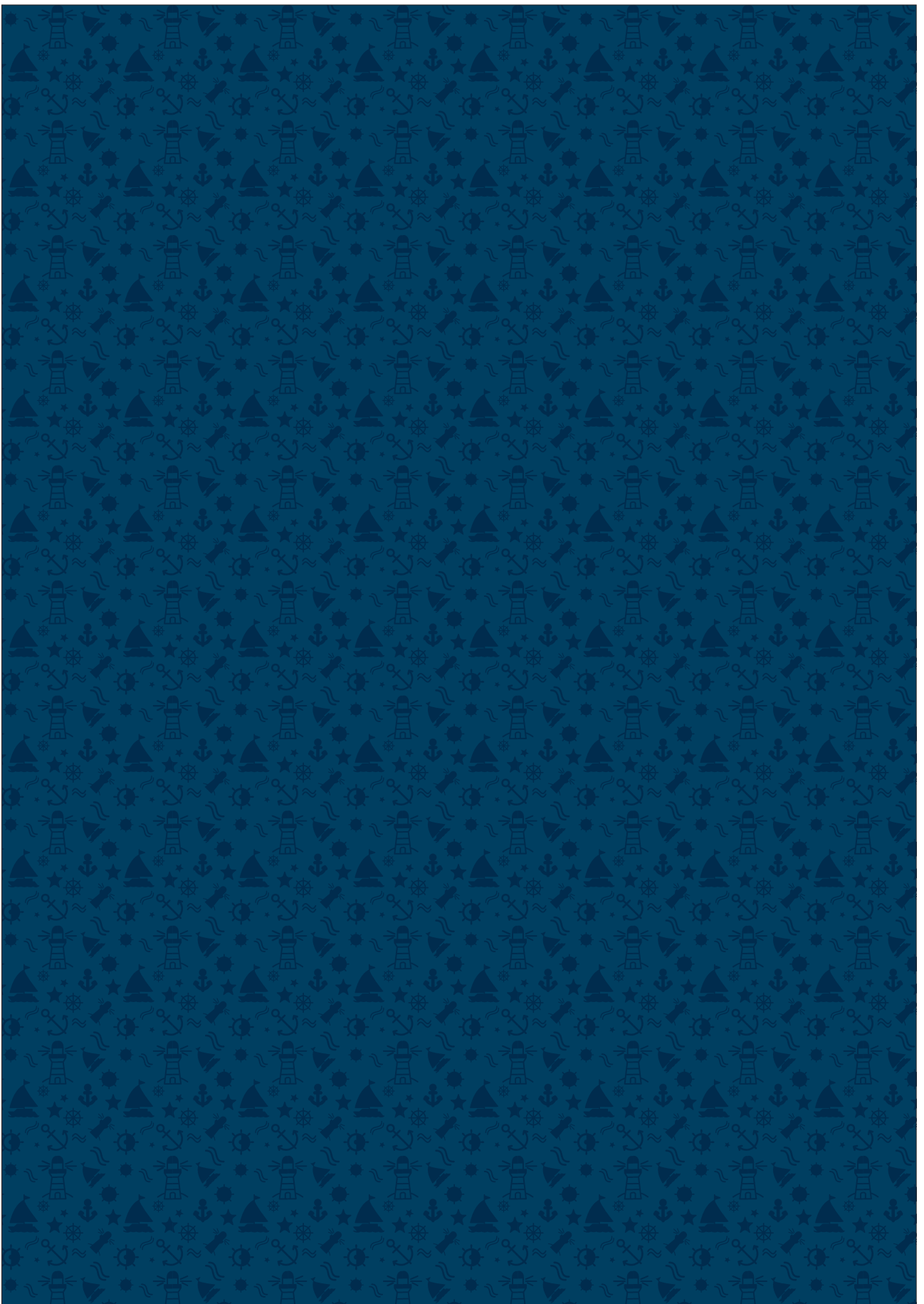

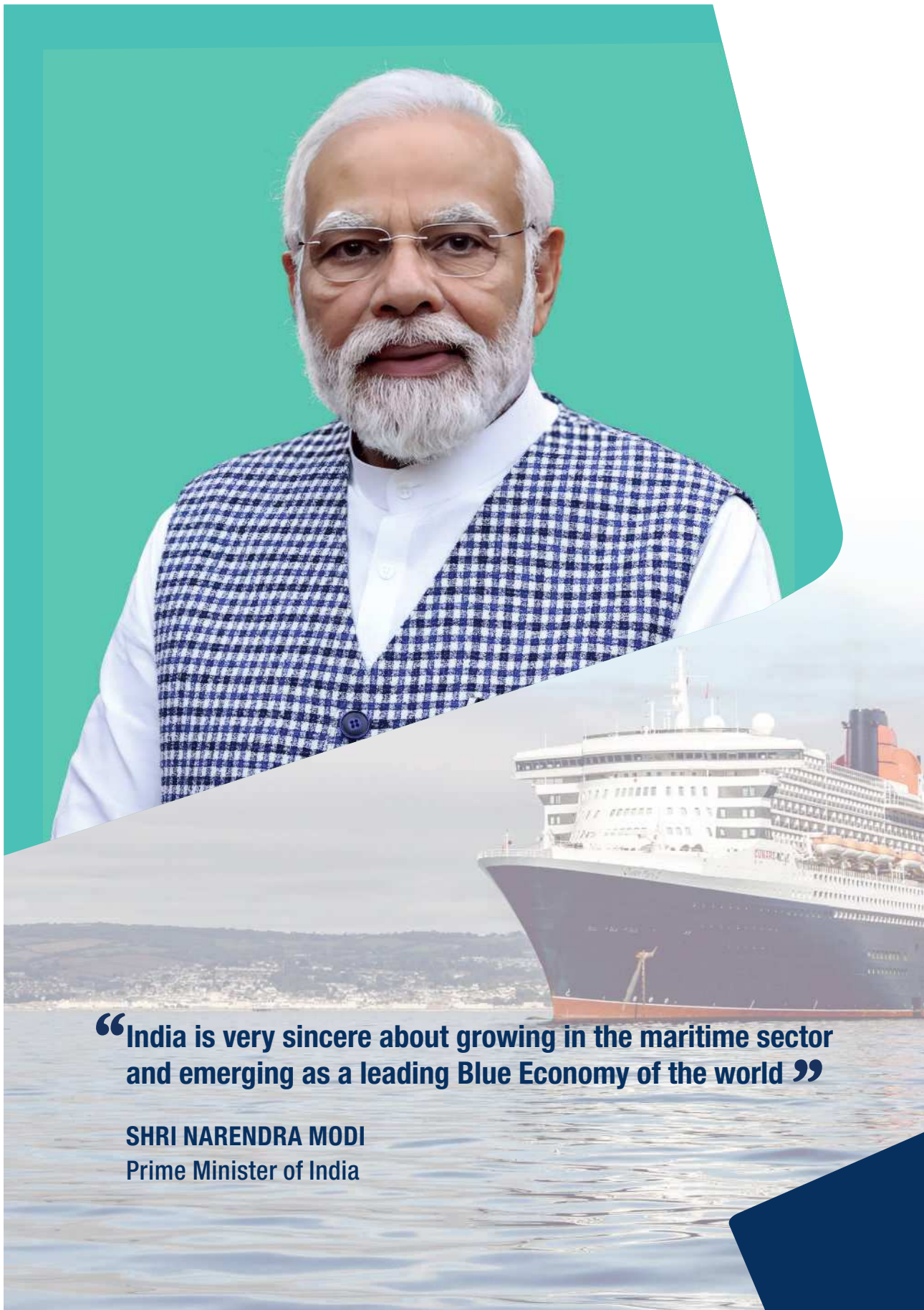

# INDIA'S MARITIME INDUSTRY

The Indian maritime sector plays a pivotal role in the economic growth of India. With a vast coastline of more than 7,500 km, India is among the largest maritime countries in the world. Being a part of the world's busiest trade route elevates the economic prominence of India's maritime sector. About 95% of India's foreign trade and 70% of its value takes place through seaways

Today, India is home to 12 major ports, over 200 ports other than major ports, 28 shipyards and a comprehensive hub of diverse maritime service providers.



## Ports

- ▲ 2500+ MTPA of port capacity
- ▲ Capacity addition of 230 MTPA in last 9 years
- ▲ Impressive TAT of upto 0.9 days (JNPA) - ahead of many leading maritime nations
- ▲ Enhancing competitiveness – 54% of cargo at major ports is handled by private ports. INR 40,000 crore worth PPP projects operationalized
- ▲ Operating sustainability - Over 100 MW of wind and solar power capacity at major ports



## Lighthouses

- ▲ 203 lighthouses and 1 lightship
- ▲ 75 lighthouses earmarked for development of tourism on PPP mode
- ▲ 23 DGPS (16 upgraded to DGNSS)
- ▲ 64 radar beacons
- ▲ National AIS network of 87 physical shore stations

## Shipping

- ▲ INR 3,500 – 4,000 Cr (USD 500 million) of ship repair industry
- ▲ 20th largest ship building sector globally with rapid capability expansion
- ▲ 2nd largest in global ship recycling
- ▲ Top 5 in trained manpower

## Waterways

- ▲ 23 operational national waterways
- ▲ Rapid expansion in the last 5 years in cargo volumes at 15% CAGR

# GMIS 2023 OVERVIEW

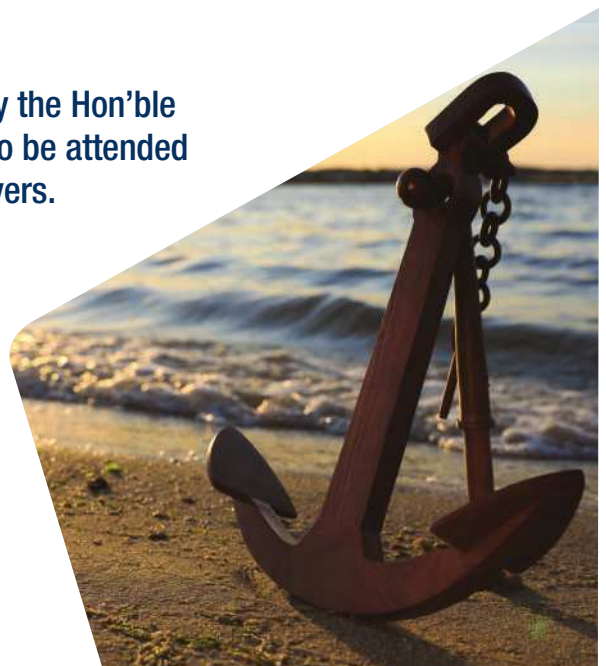

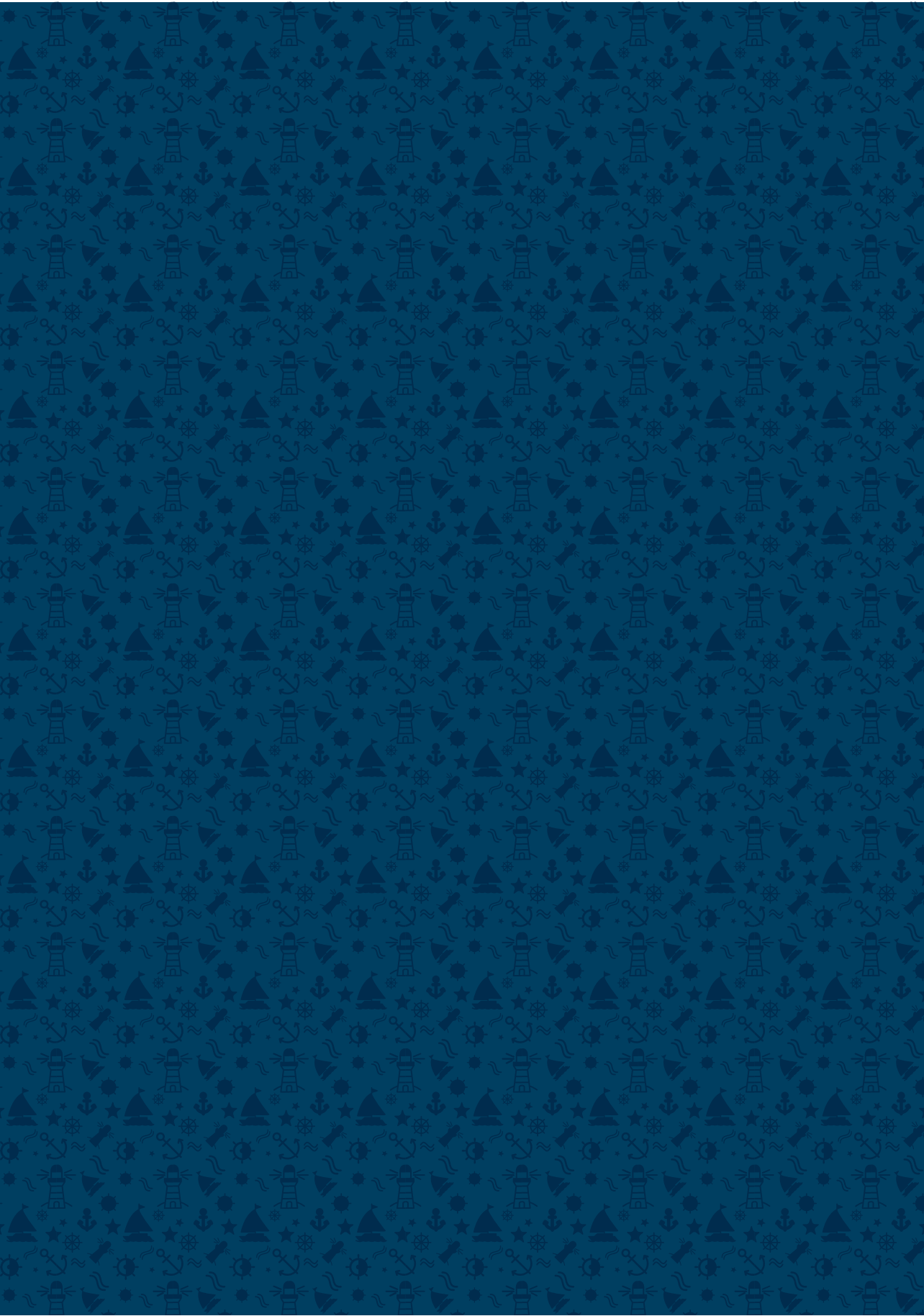

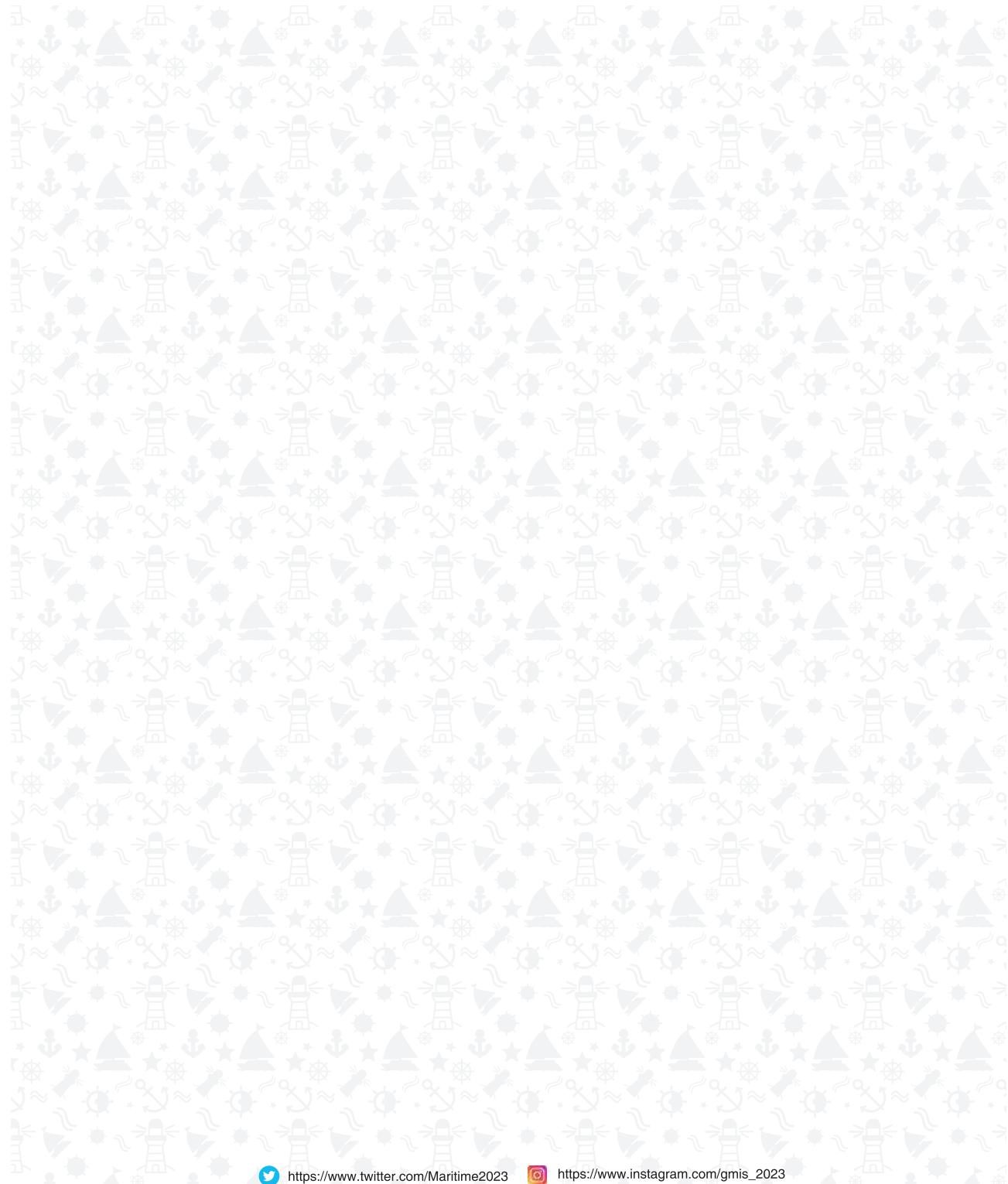
