









INDIA'S MARITIME INDUSTRY

The Indian maritime sector plays a pivotal role in the economic growth of India. With a vast coastline of more than 7,500 km, India is among the largest maritime countries in the world. Being a part of the world's busiest trade route elevates the economic prominence of India's maritime sector. About 95% of India's foreign trade and 70% of its value takes place through seaways

> Today, India is home to 12 major ports, over 200 ports other than major ports, 28 shipyards and a comprehensive hub of diverse maritime service providers.

Ports

- **2500+ MTPA of port capacity**
- Capacity addition of 230 MTPA in last 9 years
- Impressive TAT of upto 0.9 days (JNPA) - ahead of many leading maritime nations
- Enhancing competitiveness 54% of cargo at major ports is handled by private ports. INR 40,000 crore worth PPP projects operationalized
- Operating sustainability Over 100 MW of wind and solar power capacity at major ports

- INR 3,500 4,000 Cr (USD 500 million) of ship repair industry
